Whenever somebody mentions Fargo, visions of the movie by the same name come to mind. All they can think about is the scene with the wood chipper.

The Fargo area has a lot more to offer. **Don Thomson** will be hosting **the Region 7 Rally** at the West Fargo Fairgrounds **August 28 thru September 2, 2018**.

Planned activities include a day at Bonanzaville, with lunch, and the Western Minnesota Steam Threshers Reunion in Rollag, MN (a 2 day event).

Bonanzaville, located in West Fargo, North Dakota, is a pioneer village with 12 acres, 43 historic buildings, 400,000 artifacts, and millions of memories. The museum features a display on Native Americans of the Red River Valley, bonanza farms and homesteading, and the modernization of North Dakota.

Over the years, the pioneer village has grown to include the Eugene Dahl Car Museum, the Eagle Air Museum, the Tractor Museum, the Law Enforcement Museum, and more.

Western Minnesota Steam
Threshers Reunion started in
1940 with a little idea sparked from
the soul of some local Threshermen

over supper. The Nelson boys fired up the old Garr-Scott engine to thresh with steam again for old time sake with family & friends. Today the show has grown to include hundreds of demonstrations and exhibits spread over 210 beautiful acres. You can check out the details at <a href="https://rollag.com/">https://rollag.com/</a>

Some other activities available to you include:

The *Fargo Theatre* is an art deco movie *theater* in downtown *Fargo*, North Dakota, United States. It was built in 1926. It was *restored* in 1999 to its historic appearance and now is a center for the arts in the *Fargo*-Moorhead metropolitan area. The *Fargo Air Museum* is an aviation related museum in Fargo, North Dakota.

A 76-foot-long exact replica of a *Viking dragon ship*, built by some Minnesotan who just couldn't let go of a crazy idea, sits at the Heritage-Hjemkomst Interpretive Center, a museum in *Moorhead*, Minnesota. Oh...by the way. That chipper is on display at the Fargo Visitor Center with a few other items.
